

COVID Patient Recovery Alliance Commends Several Actions Included In The Biden Administration's Long-COVID Memorandum

(Washington, D.C.) – The COVID Patient Recovery Alliance, a multi-sector collaboration of leading health care organizations committed to identifying federal policy solutions that help the health care sector respond to long-COVID, applauds the Biden Administration for issuing a [Presidential Memorandum](#) on long-COVID.

Several actions outlined in the Presidential Memorandum align with the Alliance's interim recommendations, outlined in their September 2021 [report](#). These include the following:

- **Coordination Among Government Agencies**
- **Launching Centers of Excellence and Promoting Evidence-Based Care Models**
- **Expanding and Strengthening Long-COVID Clinics**
- **Promoting Provider Education and Clinical Support**
- **Connecting People with The Resources They Need**
- **Making Further Investments to Advance Long-COVID Research and Surveillance**
- **Identifying Workplace Interventions That Help Keep Individuals Connected**

The Presidential Memorandum represents an important step forward in identifying concrete solutions for individuals with long-COVID. The actions laid out in the Presidential Memorandum will help support the work already underway by medical experts and scientists, improve coordination, and connect individuals with long-COVID to resources and high-value care they need to return to thriving.

As the Administration continues to advance its existing long-COVID efforts and the actions identified in the Presidential Memorandum, the Alliance looks forward to working with members of the Administration on long-COVID federal health policies.
